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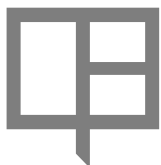
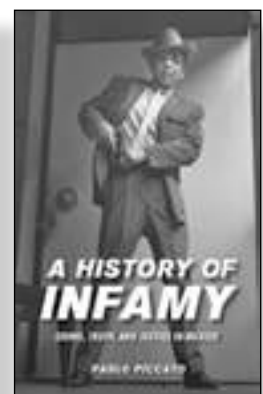
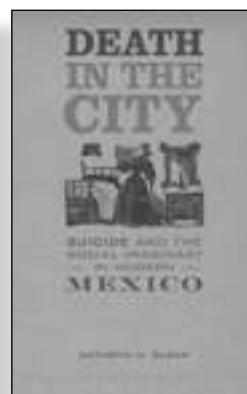
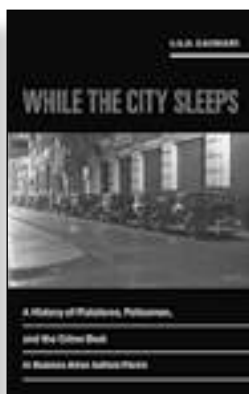


“I was so inspired by Romero’s courage and selflessness, and by the incredible struggles of so many in El Salvador who have fought for justice.
