LASA rejects the campaign against CENDES and academic freedom in Venezuela

The Center for Development Studies (CENDES) of the Central University of Venezuela, together with prominent academics associated with this institution, have been subjected to a smear campaign promoted by Venezuelan government agencies. This campaign, driven by the government of Nicolás Maduro, accuses CENDES of fomenting destabilizing activities in collaboration with national and international actors, as diverse as the Rosa Luxemburg Foundation, USAID, and the German government. These accusations are part of a new wave of repression that began on July 28, 2024, following the disputed results of the presidential elections.

The Latin American Studies Association (LASA) strongly rejects campaigns such as this, which attack academic freedom, the right to dissent and to express differences of opinion, as well as the principle of university autonomy. These are essential attributes for institutions dedicated to producing knowledge and fulfilling their social mission, which is indispensable for societies to develop in peace, with inclusion and well-being for all their members. The practices of authoritarian governments directed against figures in academia and human rights defenders—such as those currently being deployed in Venezuela—conspire against democratic coexistence and increasingly erode the conditions necessary for stability and development in our countries.

At this difficult time, we wish to express our solidarity and support to the professors directly targeted by the Venezuelan government: Francisco Javier Velasco, Alexandra Martínez, Edgardo Lander, and Emiliano Terán Mantovani. We also extend this support to the members of the Center for Development Studies (CENDES) and, more broadly, to the entire academic community of the Central University of Venezuela, in the face of attacks seeking to undermine academic freedom and university autonomy.
